Diesel Boom Lift Parts - Boom lifts are likewise referred to as aerial work platforms. They can include a bucket or platform that is connected to the end of a hydraulic lifting system. They are usually mounted on the back of a truck and in this case, normally called a "bucket truck."

The buckets which are attached to the end of the boom lift is meant to enable a person to stand in and work from. Commonly, the bucket will have a duplicate set of controls which are used to manipulate the position of the bucket. The driver in the bucket has the ability to position themselves. Some boom lifts include telescoping lifting arms that enable much flexibility as far as the reaching capacity is concerned. Usually, there are automatic safety controls in order to avoid the machine from tipping over. When operating in tight spaces, articulated boom lifts are more available as opposed to stick booms, particularly if the application calls for clearing nearby obstacles.

Initially meant for use in orchards, boom lifts are still a common sight in different agricultural applications. This machine allows the fruit picker to pick fruit high in a tree with relative ease. Similar equipment is used by telephone and cable businesses as well as electrical providers who do maintenance and installation on utility poles. Boom lifts can also be utilized for hanging Christmas banners and light displays.

Instead of using the traditional ladder, many modern fire trucks use a boom lift instead. This particular kind of boom lift is called a snorkel and there are window cleaners who use them too. Boom lifts are utilized in various trades. They are normally relied on for exterior painting, and by arborists who should work safely within high trees. Boom lifts are usually found in the construction business.

There are segments of the entertainment trade who utilize boom lifts. An example is Michael Jackson, who normally started live performances of his hit song "Beat It" while being on a moving boom lift.
